
Project Goals

- Treatment services




Technical Assistance Opportunities



Single County Authority (SCA) Engagement Type (N=47)

Local treatment programs are administered through county drug and alcohol offices called Single County Authorities. These programs can help with treatment funding, assess the need for treatment or other services, and make referrals to match treatment and/or service needs.

- PrEP can prevent HIV transmission from sex or injection drug use
- PrEP is most effective if taken as prescribed
- PrEP can be taken as a daily pill or as an injection every 60 days



ALL ABOUT HEPATITIS A

WHAT IS HEPATITIS A?

Hepatitis A is a liver infection caused by the hepatitis A virus. For most people, hepatitis A is a short term illness and goes away on its own. For people who are immunocompromised or who have chronic liver disease, the illness caused by hepatitis A can be more serious and lead to hospitalization.

HOW IS IT TRANSMITTED?

By consuming microscopic amounts of feces (poop) of someone who has hepatitis A. This can happen through sex, sharing drug prep equipment, or eating contaminated food.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?



Many people have no symptoms. If they do have symptoms, they can include:

nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, grey poop, fatigue, joint pain, fever, dark colored pee, or jaundice (yellowing of the eyes)

CAN IT BE PREVENTED? Yes! Hepatitis A is vaccine preventable.

The best way to prevent hepatitis A is by getting vaccinated. The vaccine is given as 2 doses, 6 months apart.

HEPATITIS B

WHAT IS HEPATITIS B?

Hepatitis B is a liver infection caused by the hepatitis B virus. It can be both short term or long term. Chronic hepatitis B is not curable, but can be managed as a medical condition. Not everybody requires treatment.

HOW IS IT TRANSMITTED?

Blood to blood contact, sex, and during pregnancy or childbirth.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

Many people have no symptoms.

If they do, they can include: fatigue, joint pain, fever, dark urine, abdominal pain, grey stool, jaundice (yellowing of the eyes), nausea or vomiting.

CAN IT BE PREVENTED? Yes! Hepatitis B is vaccine preventable.



The best way to prevent hepatitis B is by getting vaccinated. The vaccine is 2 or 3 doses given a few months apart.




