Round 1: October-November 2020= 56 responses

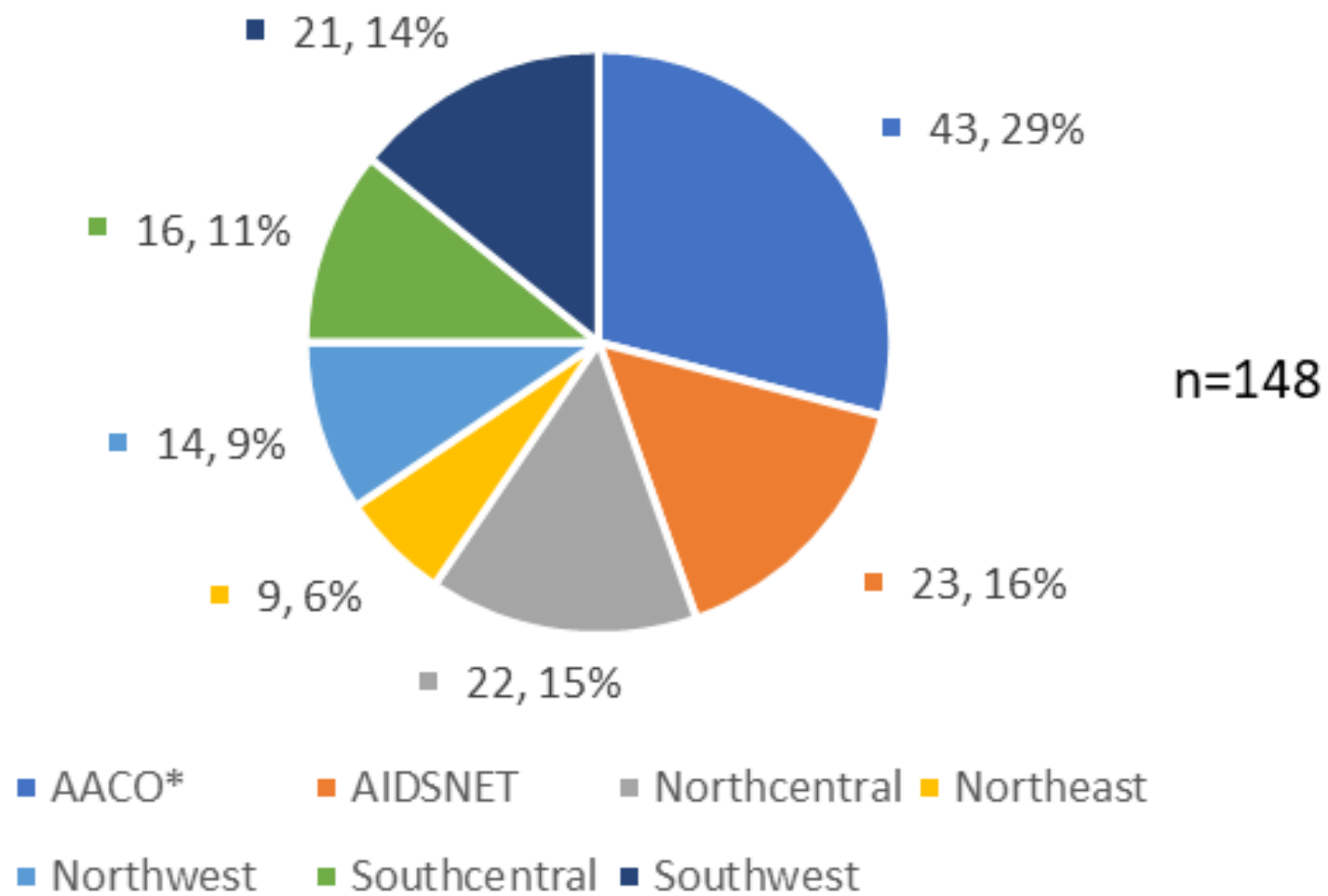
Round 2: May-November 2021= 92 responses

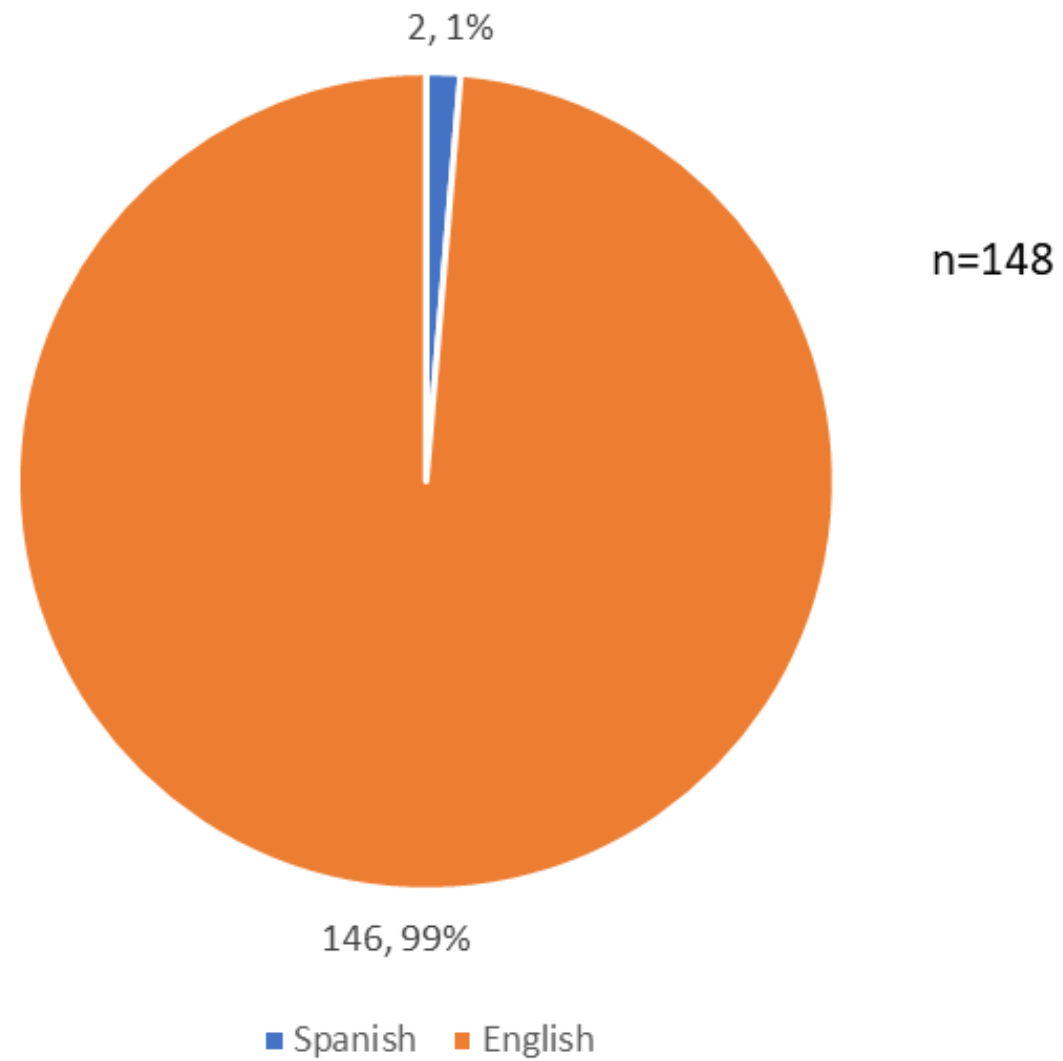

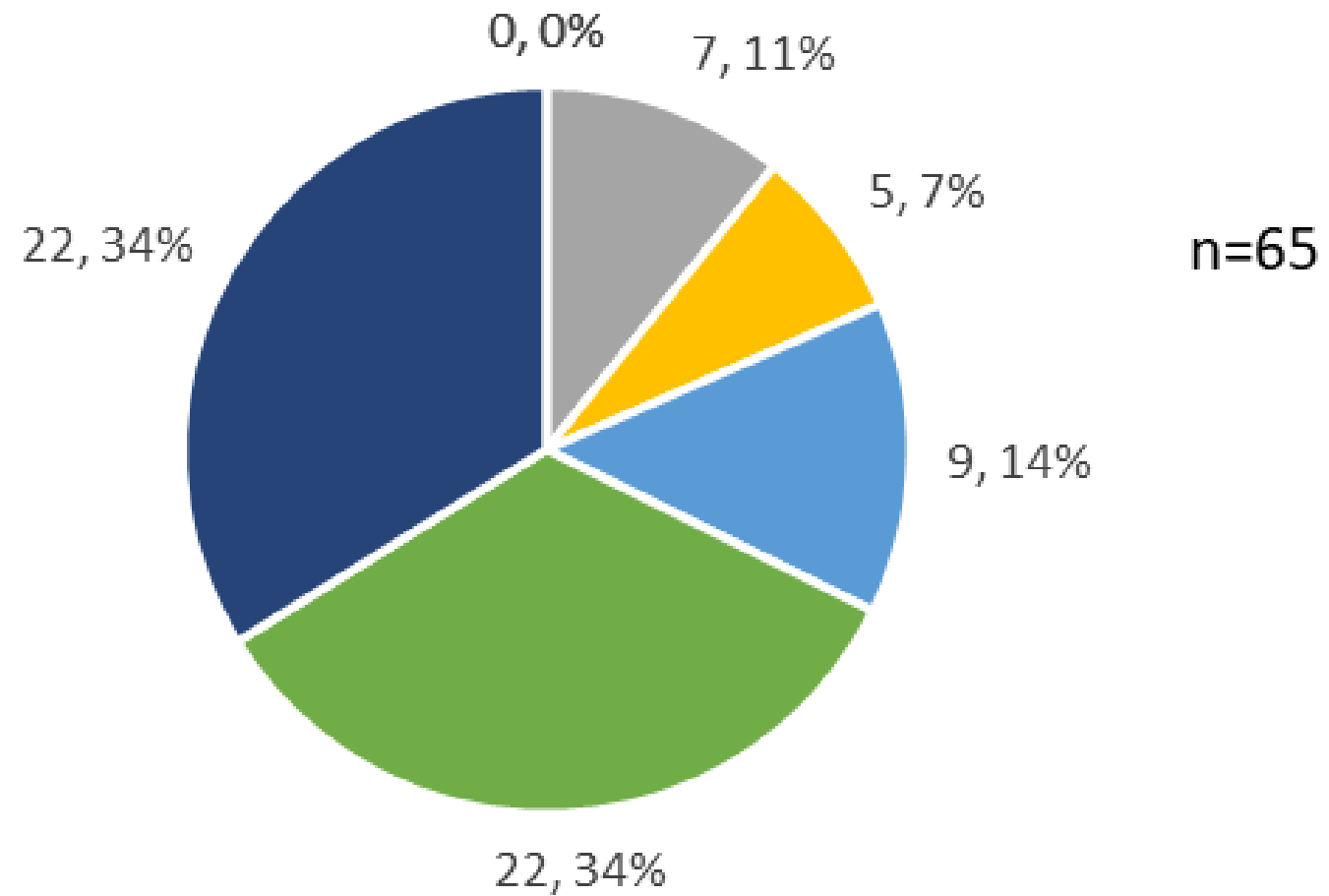
## Number of Participants By Region



## Number of Participants by Language of survey

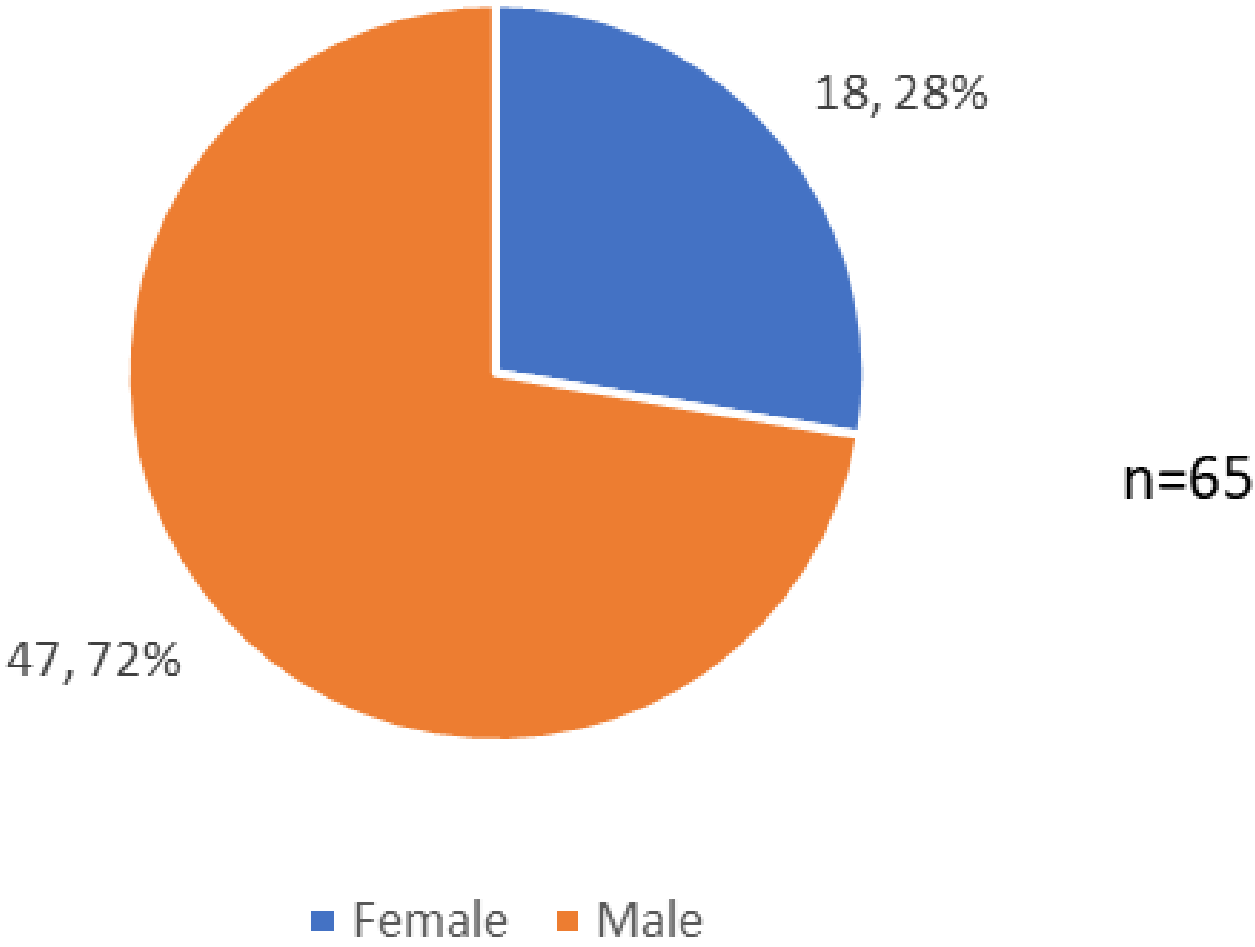


# Number of Participants by Age

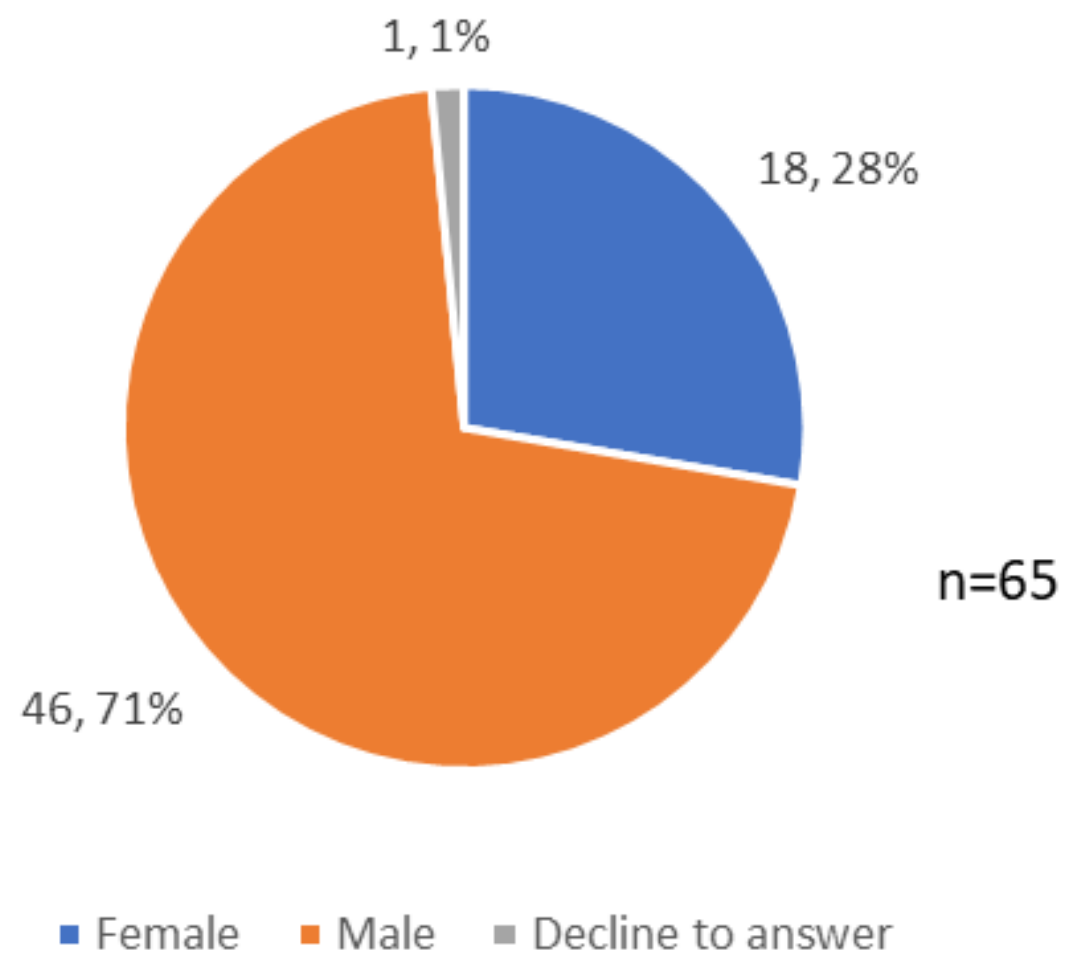

# Number of participants by gender

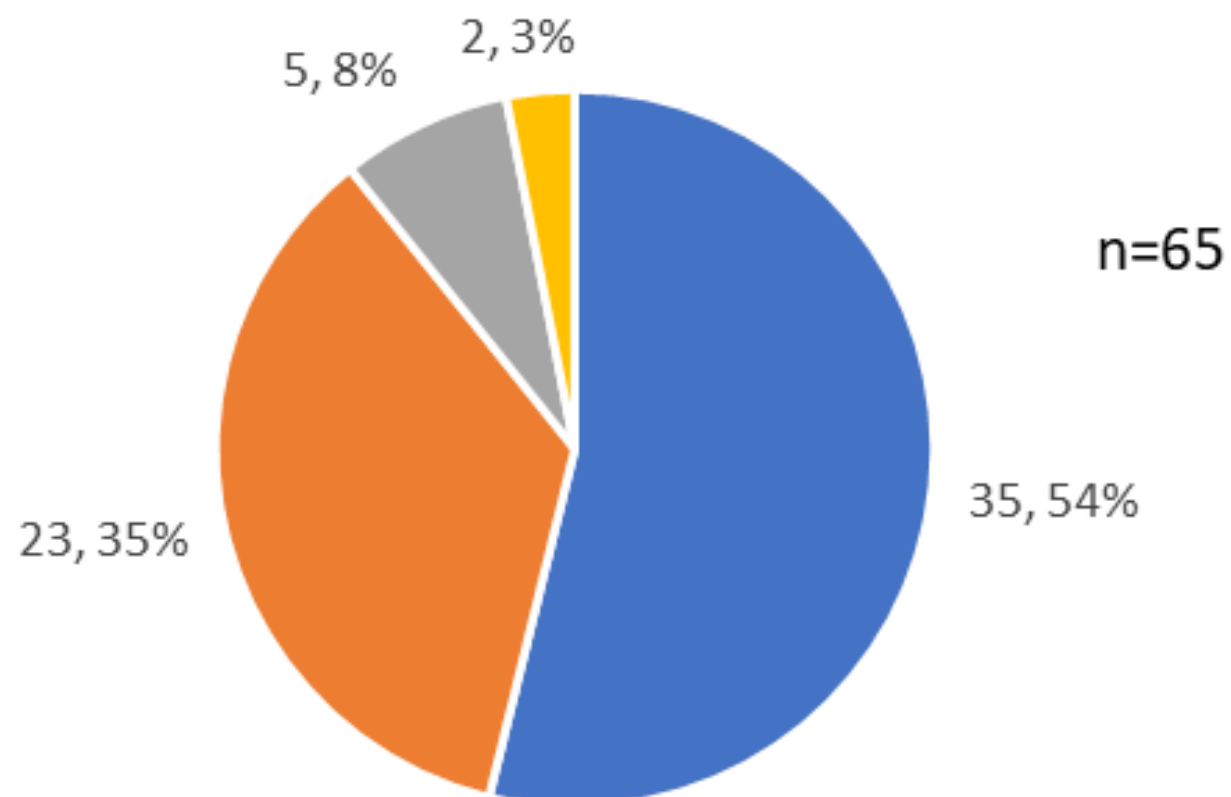


## Number of participants by sex assigned at birth



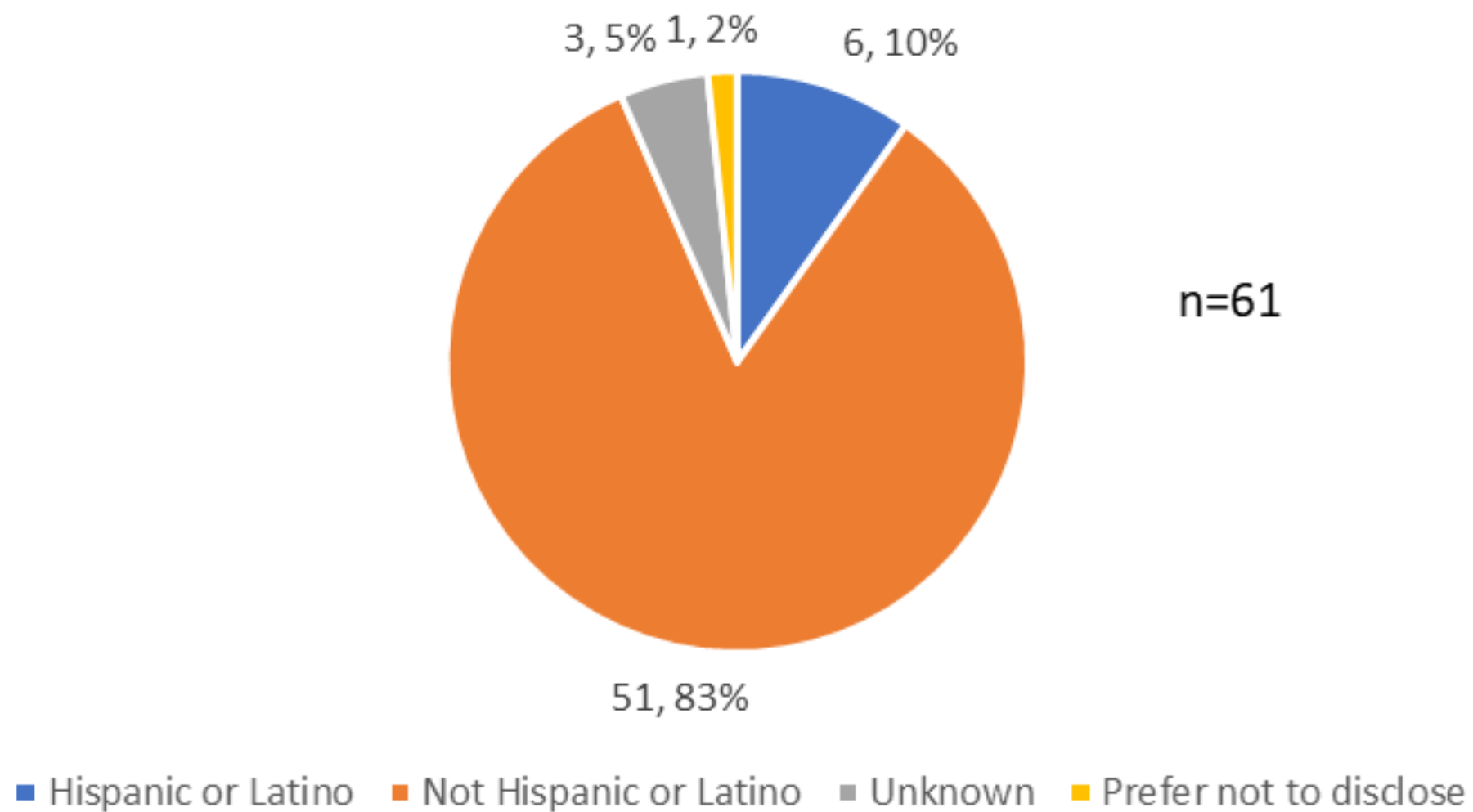


## Number of participants by sexual orientation

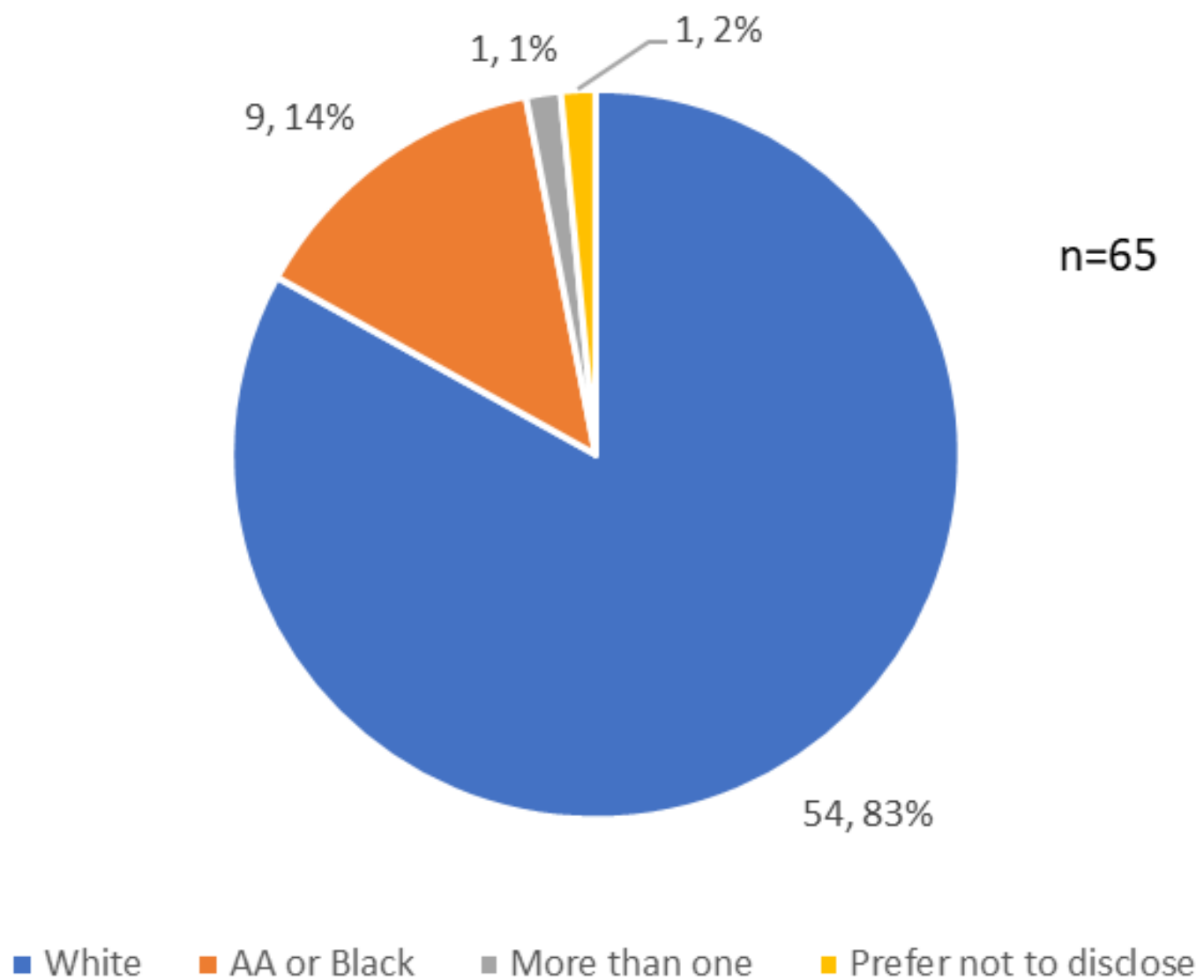

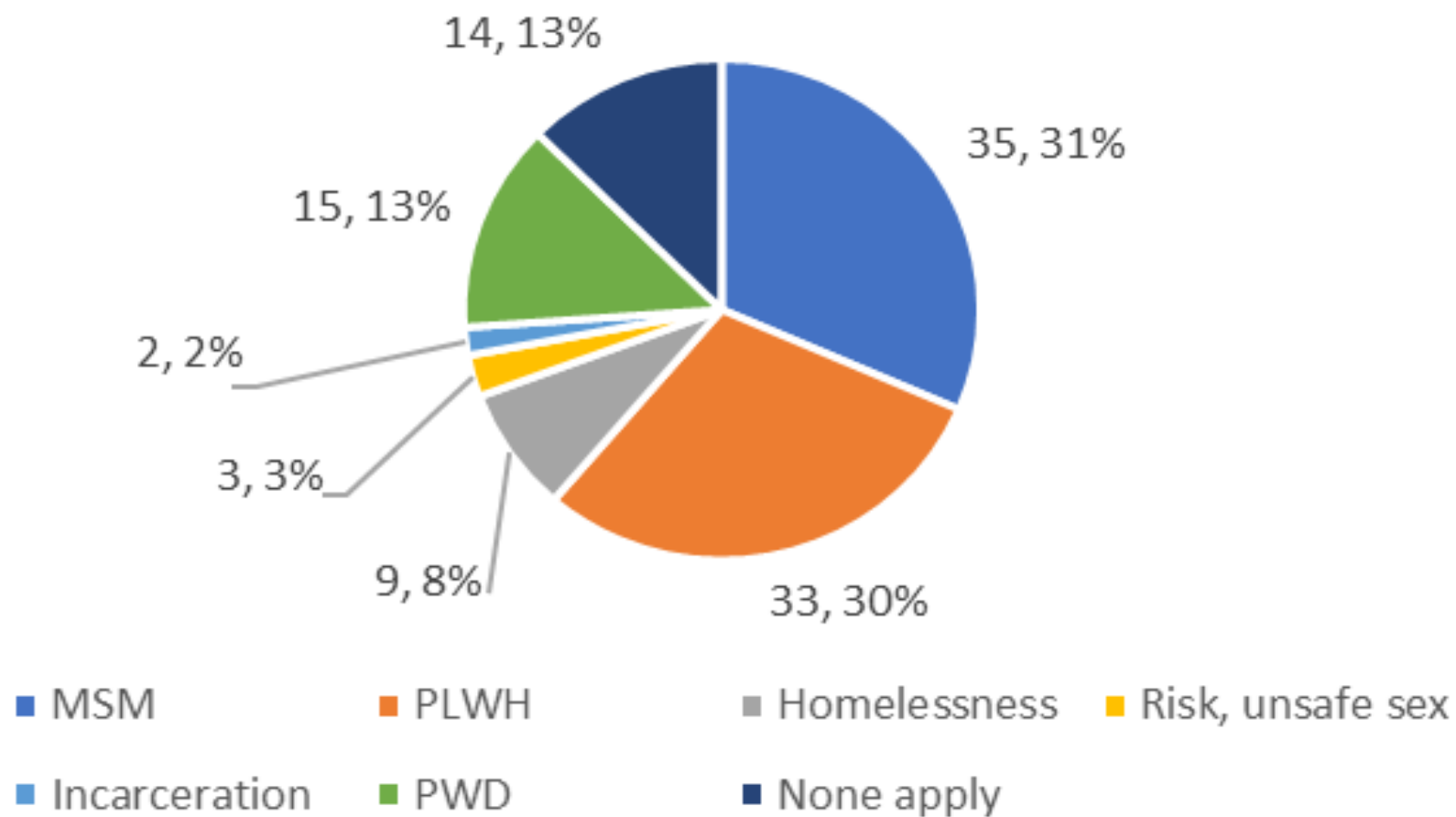
## Number of participants by ethnicity



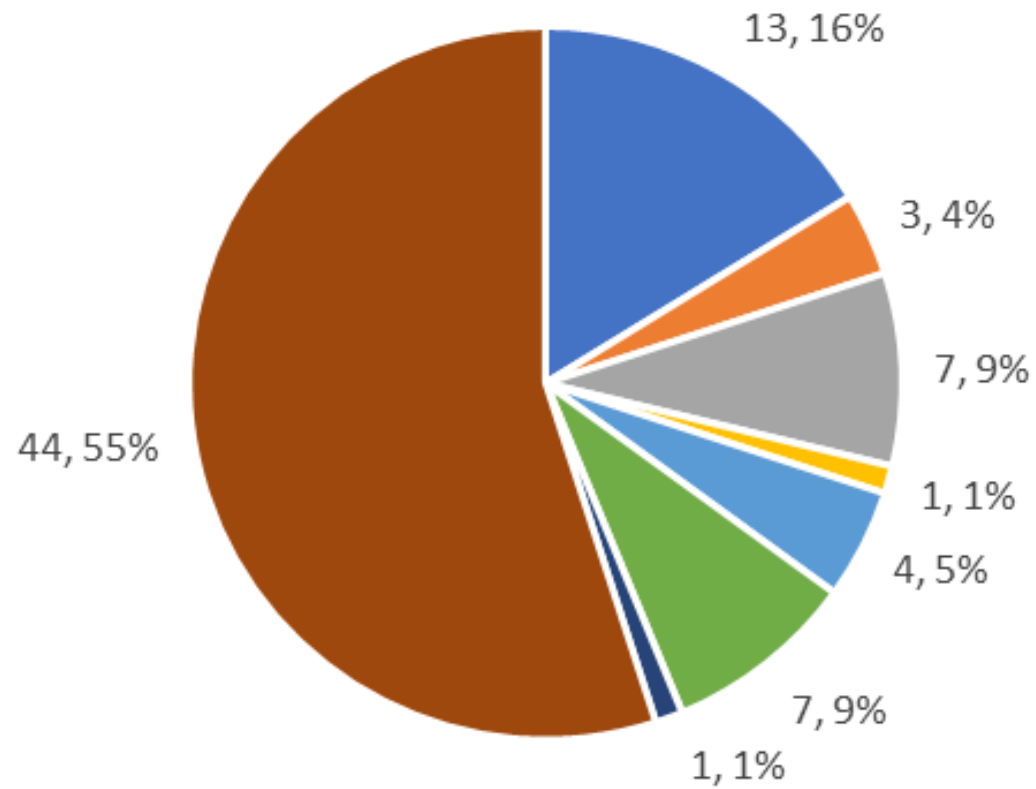

## Number of participants by group membership (choose all that apply)

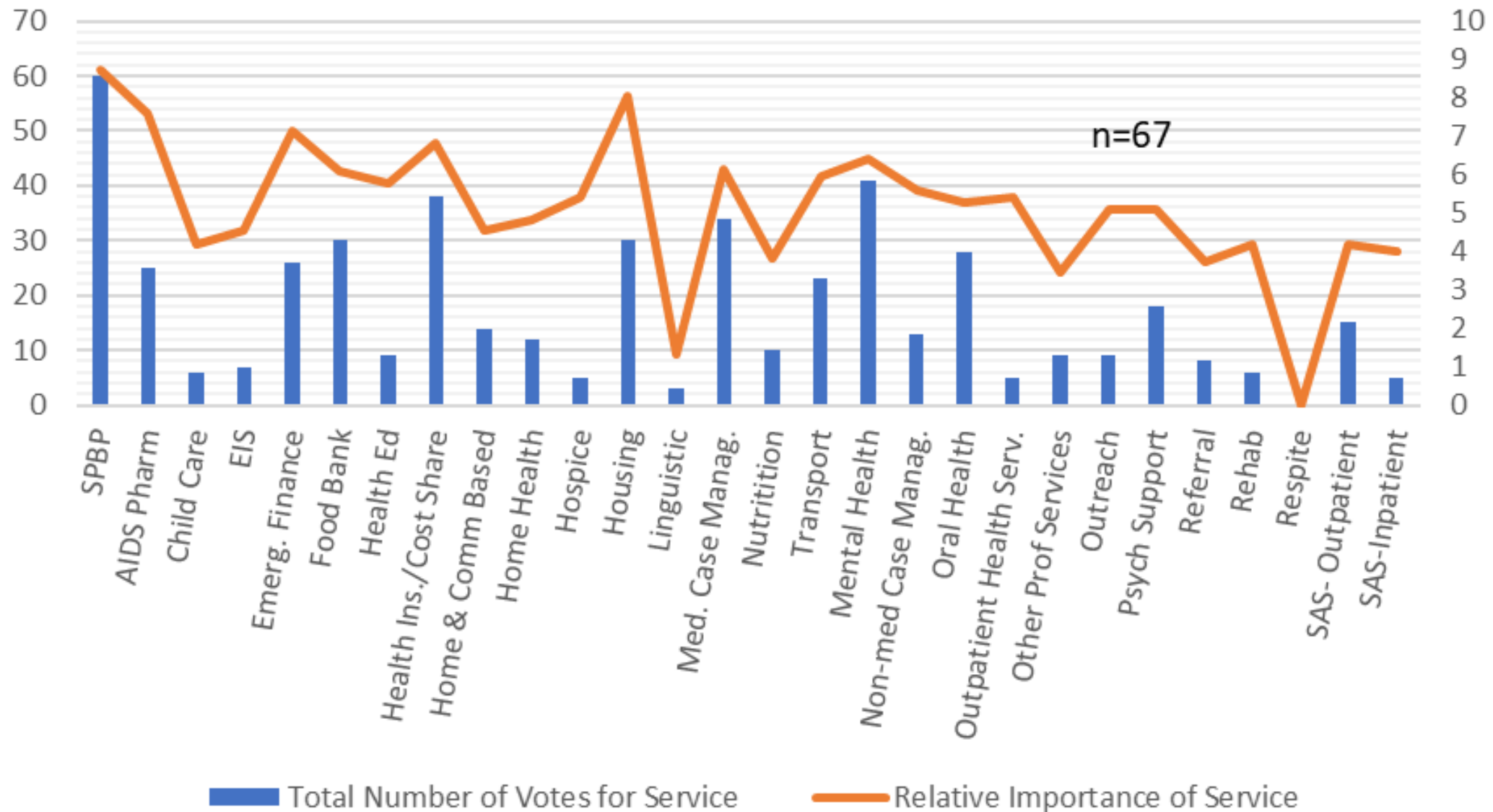

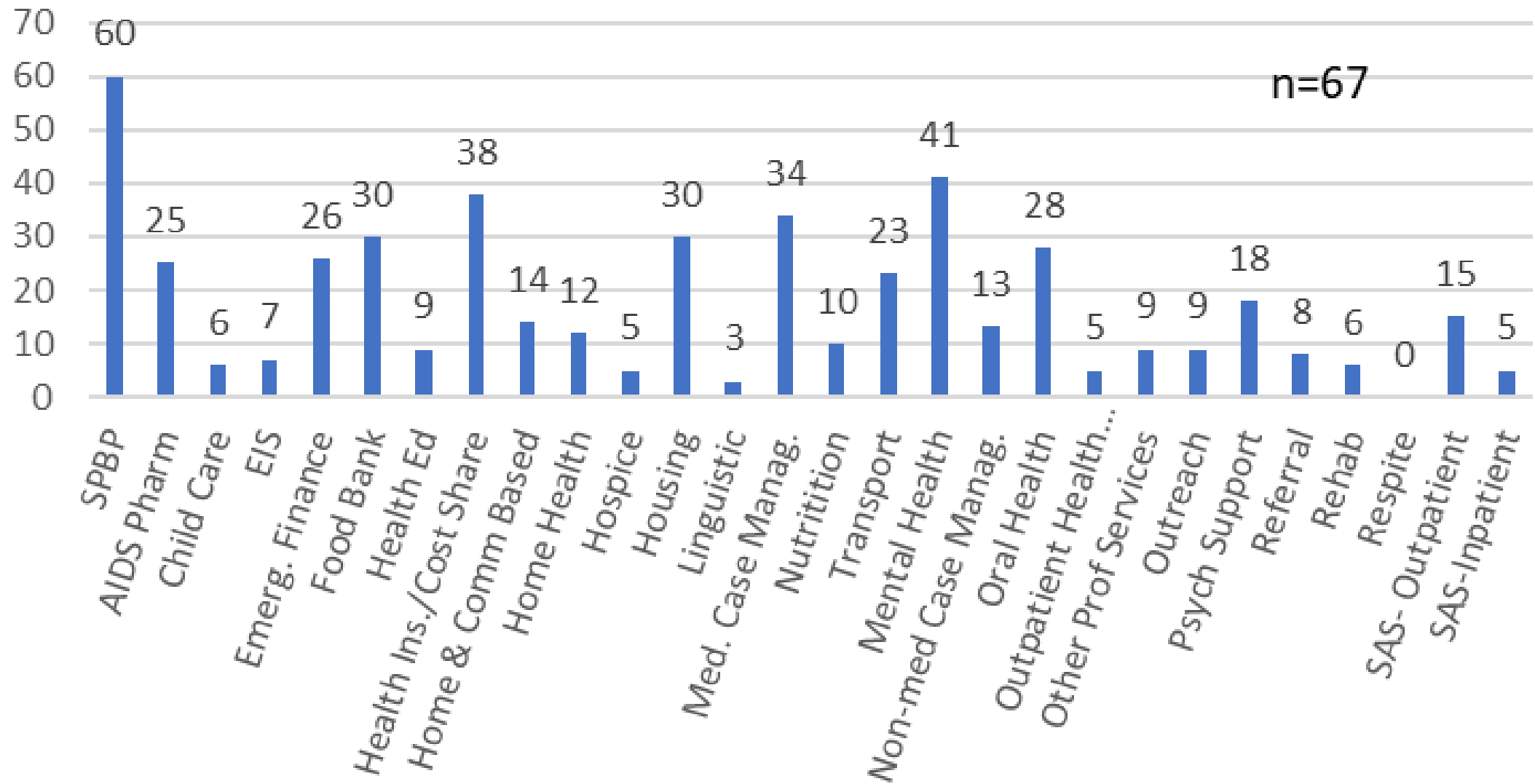

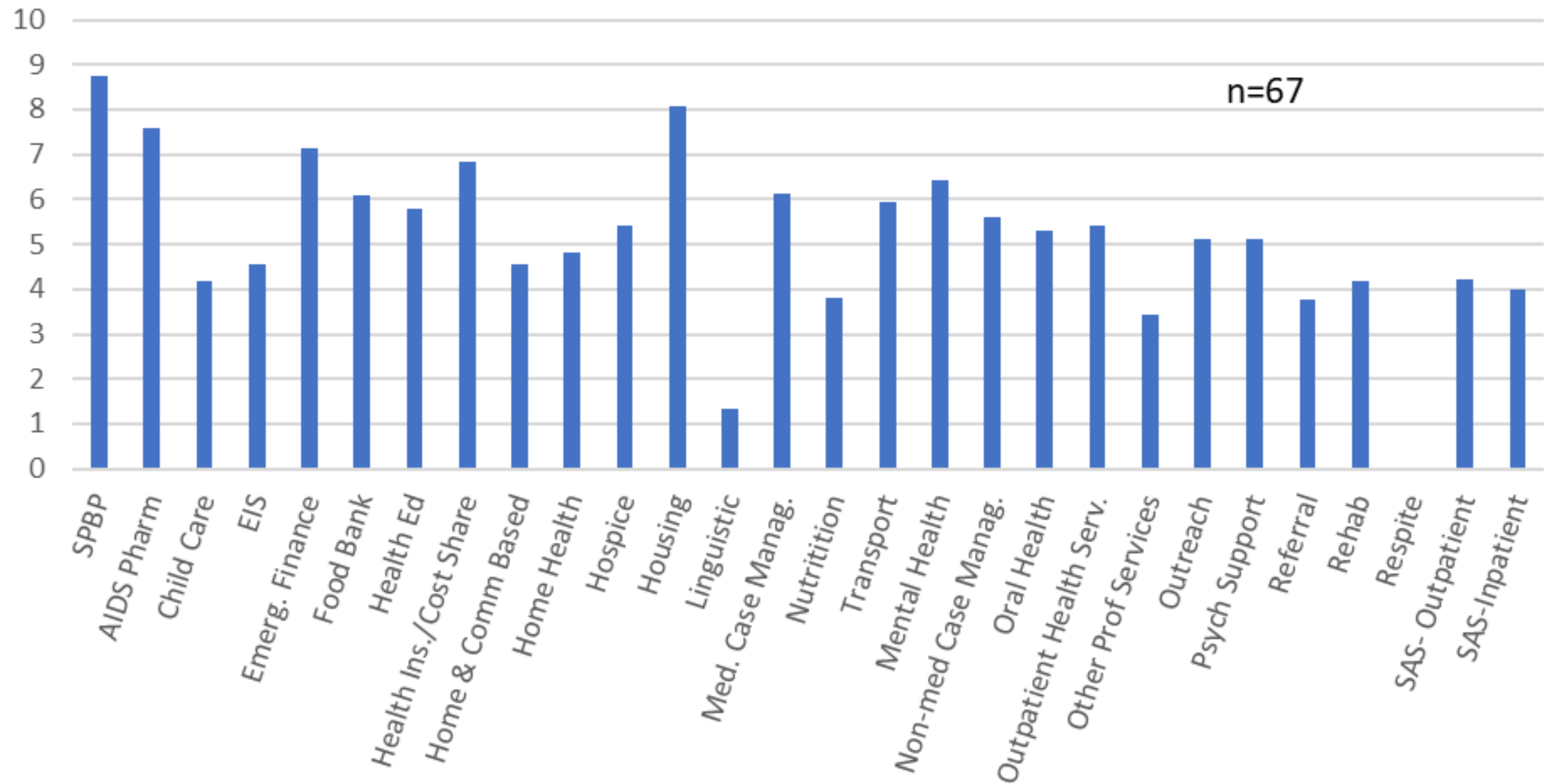
## Overall ranking by all participants (Statewide)

# Themes from open text responses

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- These are ALL essential!
  - “10 choices are not enough”
  - “Honestly, we need all of those services funded. Resent/frustrating having to limit to 10”
- Value of SPBP
  - “The prescription benefit is a lifesaver”
- Mental Health
  - “Let other people try to live a lifetime with a disease that is still stigmatized. See how that impacts your mental health on any given day.”

# Themes from open text responses

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- Housing:

- “housing must come first, first priority otherwise, will not be able to get/stay in care. but if able, I would have put all others as number 2 in priority equally.”
- “We cannot end the epidemic if we allow people living with HIV to be homeless”

- Dental Services

- “Oral health is so important. I still go to a dental clinic. Why? My private dentist refuses to treat anyone with HIV. Isn’t that interesting?”
- “Oral care is difficult to find that will accept this type of payment.”

# Themes from open text responses

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- Services vs. availability are two different things:
  - “It's nice that oral care is available, try finding a dentist that will work with the program is almost impossible. Why not pay for dental insurance?”
  - “There are no programs to be had [in my county]”
  - “I've not been made of aware of what I can get in my home town”
- These needs are evolving
  - aging population, advances in HIV care,
- People want to be involved in decision making!
  - Ex: response about living with HIV for 28 years, high profile and many awards- has never been asked to join “Ryan White Council”
