 New position was created for a supervisor for the field staff— 	
Community Health Supervisor	
 We are working on filling it 	
CDC and HRSA conference call	
 They provided feedback on the integrated plan—there were no big surprises 	
 Gave more detailed comments on epi data and tightening timelines 	
 Overall, they said nothing major that wasn't previously provided on written feedback 	
 Mike Hellman added that the CDC was very appreciative of the HPG suggestions to the plan 	
• Secretary of Health preparing budget for briefing—end of February or early	
March	
 We will brief her and provide justifications for our state appropriations 	
• Spending	
 A considerable amount of our rebate dollars will support our upcoming media campaign 	
 There will be spending on data system upgrades to support the 	
infrastructure of the program	
o Conference	
 We're hoping to support a statewide HIV-related conference for 2 of the 5 years 	
 Another option is mini grants for organizations to help address some 	
of the factors that impact HIV epidemics	
Chapter 27 reporting regulations	
o Includes HIV and a lot of other disease reporting as well	

- We're trying to change it to get all viral loads to be reported regardless of the result
- We have expressed the need and urgency of this change and have gotten the right people to listen
- o This will take time

Mari Jane Salem-Noll (Prevention Section):

- New Personnel
 - Katina's old position (Public Health Assistant Administrator) has been filled
 - He will be starting in February
 - He'll be working on grants and PPAs, as well as monitoring
 - o Another position has been posted today—PrEP Coordinator
- Godwin Obiri and I are working together to submit a new budget
 - Prevention got about \$200,000 less than we asked for, but still more than previous years
- Currently writing 6-year close out report and will be submitting it to the CDC

Christine Quimby:

- Assistant Administrator position has been posted
 - o We'll be getting a list of possible candidates soon
- 4 of 7 regional monitoring visits completed for Ryan White
- We're trying to finalize agreements for care services
 - O Services would begin on 7/1/2018 and end 6/30/2020

SPBP:

John Haines:

- Online enrollment
 - o The system is built and is in the final stages of testing
 - o It will hopefully be deployed in 2-3 months
- Health insurance premium assistance program has slowed down
 - Highmark and IBC have signed on
 - o It's going to be a while before this is rolled out
- Medicaid back-billing and Medicaid wrap around coverage
 - We want those who have Medicaid coverage to also have SPBP coverage
 - Waiting on final approvals to come through from DOH and others
 - Will hopefully happen soon
- ADR—data report we send to HRSA every year that summarizes all the end
 of year data
 - We expect the requirements to be released and it's usually due between April and June
- Media Campaign

- We will be starting a statewide HIV media campaign using the 5year plan and rebate dollars
- Looking at radio, TV, and other media—hopefully will be launched in June
- SPBP Advisory Council conference call—January 25th from10am-12pm

- Flyers provided in the back regarding upcoming events and webinars
 - o There are a few webinars about substance abuse in January
 - o February will be on women's health
 - o March will be on minority health
- April 18th—conference on women, women's health, and the intersection of HIV, Hep C, and substance use
- We're starting to plan World AIDS Day 2018—November 30th
 - Will with the 30th anniversary—it's going to be big!
- We will hopefully hold an ACRN review course
 - o First time being offered in Western PA
 - Good certification for nurses
 - More info to come

Nicole Risner (Medical Assistance):

- It has been announced that Governor Wolf is going to have an Opioid Press Conference to declare PA's heroin and opioid epidemic a statewide emergency
 - This will allow for funds to coordinate better statewide prevention efforts
 - Will pull funds and resources from other places, such as natural disaster relief
 - Aaron Arnold mentioned that syringe exchange was left out of the plan of emergency.
 - It's doubtful it will be included, even though there is a statewide consensus that it should be.

Jill Garland:

- Action items that relate to our first goal in the plan—allocating our funding in geographic distribution of the epidemic. We have HRSA site feedback regarding how we are utilizing rebate dollars across Ryan White Part B program.
 - We have evaluated and analyzed our spending and we're trying to develop program to ensure we're maximizing our resources while complying with federal requirements
 - Moni has been helping us with a resource allocation model based on need, and we are close to getting final numbers
 - We think all grantees and contractors we support will continue to get the same amount of funding, and many will see increases
 - We've also been able to allocate resources to statewide initiatives like PrEP

Aaron Arnold

- Last meeting we mentioned an HIV outbreak near Charleston, Virginia
 - There has been another outbreak confirmed in Northern Kentucky and the Cincinnati metro area—45% increase in HIV transmission
 - This is becoming a pattern
